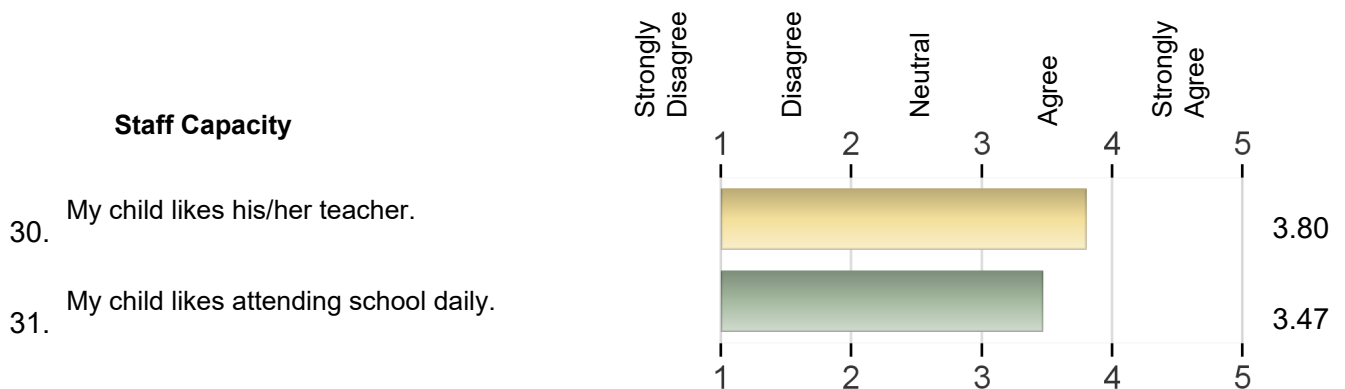
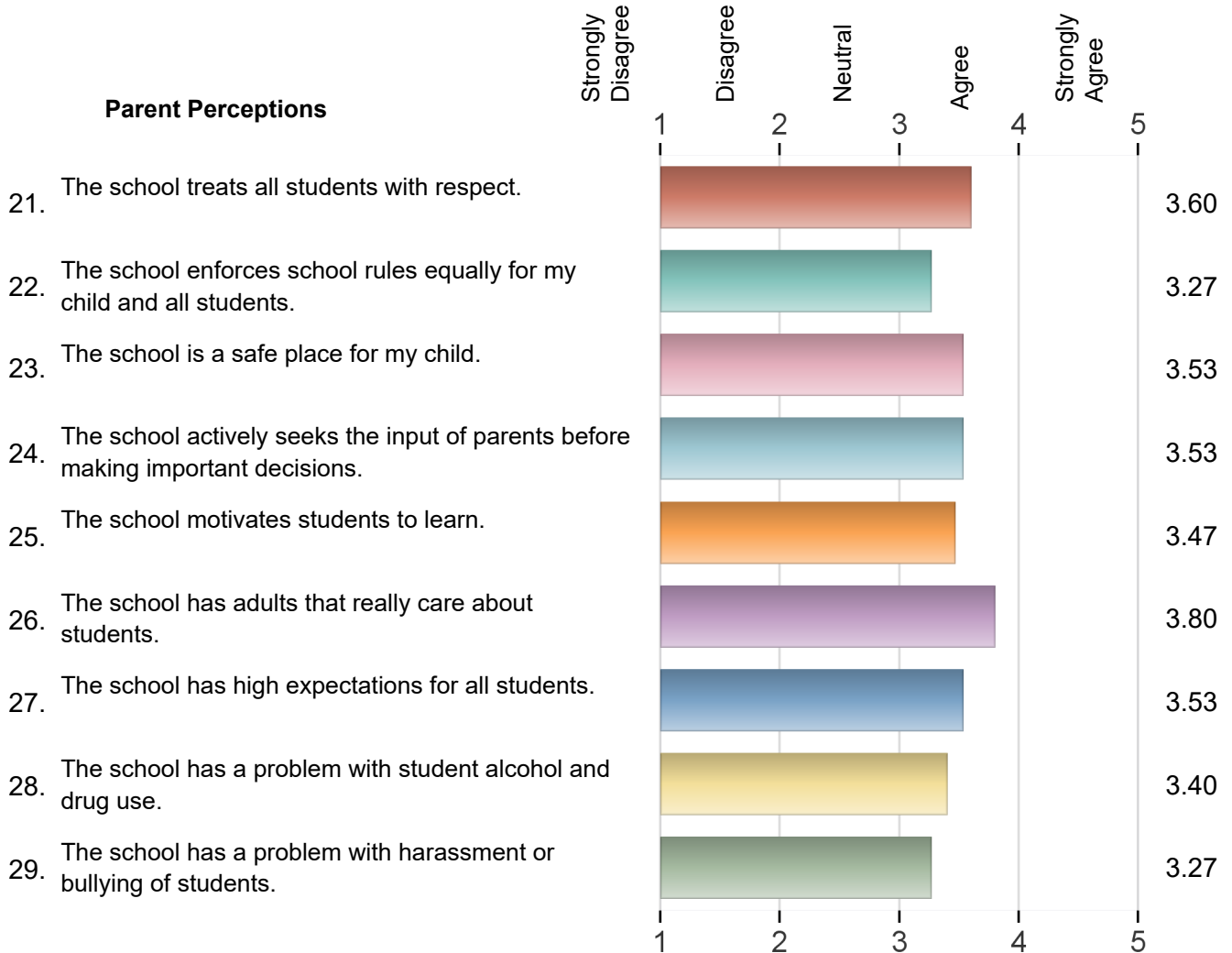


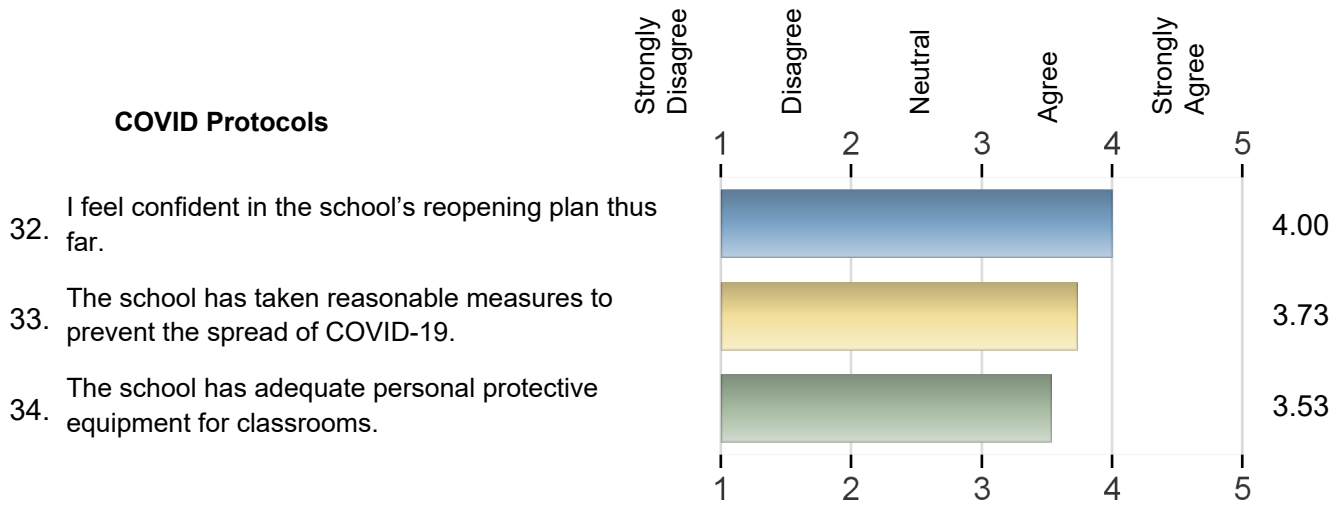
Staff Capacity

- Since we've been there thus far I've been really disappointed with the counselor and the lack of attention given to my daughter and how dismissive she has been. Not getting back to her emails etc.
We had one sport where the coach is horrible. No constructive criticism or help to get better, nor a "good job" either. Def plays favorites and the senior parents say it's been like that for years. I was concerned about the situation, the other day with the guy running across the way from El Rancho and how he made his way into a classroom. I think Elysia Lewis did a great job communicating about that whole day, but the fact that I found out from a student that he actually made his way into a classroom is very concerning.
I don't really know what goes on there or if it's a budget concern but the fact that the high school doesn't offer more classes and electives that other schools have makes my daughter want to go elsewhere and I follow her concerns.
- I hope the school intends to have a better system in place for getting our students ready to apply for college in the coming years. More push for how to write personal statements, scholarships, when to have letters of recommendation ready, how much college apps are going to cost. More information as much in advance to give parents time to save money for senior year (ie. Sr. Photos, yearbook, events, college applications, cap and gown, Jostens) a list of what is coming would be great.
